# MY STORY OF HOW TITUS HUNTER BECAME A RECOGNIZED PATRIOT OF THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR BY DAR

"The Daughters of the American Revolution is an organization with a deeply rich history while also being truly relevant in today's world. More than 1,000,000 women have joined the organization since it was founded over 125 years ago. They became members to honor their heritage as well as make a difference in their communities across the country and the world."

My personal interest in genealogy started around 1957. When as a small girl I would rummage through my great grandmother's cedar chest. (Mary Pearle Gray) It was magical to explore the papers and keepsakes that she had collected in her lifetime. I also loved to look at the pictures in the family Bible. In the center of the Bible was several family history pages written by Mary's father. (Eli Dorsey Gray)

Little did I know how important that Bible would be 64 years later during the process applying for membership in the DAR using Mary's 2<sup>nd</sup> great grandfather **Titus Hunter.** 

My father (Roy Henry Drake Sr.) also loved genealogy and when I became an adult we visited many graveyards and old homestead to trace our family history. When Mary Pearle Gray died, my father's siblings were not that interested in her family collection. Many of the pictures and documents went to my father including the family Bible.

In the 1970's I was married and had three little girls but I always found time to do genealogy. In those days it meant ordering microfilm and spending hours at the library. I also made several trips to Monroe County Indiana to visit the historical society and even a 93 year old relative. This kind man let me make copies of his pictures and documents and told me many great family stories.

The Monroe County Historical Society had extensive documents of the Sullivan family. In one 43 page family history I read about **Titus Hunter** for the first time. Titus was born in 1756 in Louisa County, Virgina, USA and died in 1814 in Green County, Kentucky, USA. In the 43 page family history there is an extensive story of his escapades in the Revolutionary War. In one such escapade, several guards had disappeared from their post and were never found. Titus volunteered to take the watch that evening and said he was going to shoot anything that moved. In the process he killed a pig that was foraging near him. As it turned out, that pig was the enemy inside of a pig carcass who had been killing the guards and carrying them away. This story is written in a children's schoolbook which I have been lucky enough to find and buy.

**Titus Hunter** was the father of Sarah Ann Hunter (born 1794 in Virginia, died 12 August 1847 in Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana, USA). Sarah married James Spencer Sullivan 13 May 1819, in Greeensburg, Green County, Kentucky, USA. This union was the beginning of the Hunters in my line.

In 2017 I posted a story on my Facebook page about another patriot in my line, Robert Gray. After reading that, a friend of mine, contacted me and asked if I had ever considered applying for membership to the DAR. She then introduced me to the registrar from her chapter. We began the process of finding the necessary documents connecting myself with the chosen patriot. After trying for several months to get all the necessary documents together for Robert Gray I because discouraged and put my application aside.

In October of 2020 my husband and I took a second trip to Monroe County Indiana and found obscure family cemeteries and even more documents. I was encouraged about completing my DAR application, so I called my local DAR chapter and restarted the process. I was put in touch with my local registrar, Margaret Sopp, who turned out to be a godsend. She was patient and diligent and

nationally recognized as a genealogist. we tried a total of six possible patriots before we were finally able to find most of the documents required. We just kept coming up one short of what was needed. The ideal way to proceed is to find a patriot that has already been approved by the DAR because then it isn't necessary to prove his military record in addition to all the other requirements. Using Titus Hunter as the patriot for DAR membership was not my first choice because he had never been proven a patriot.

Just as I was about to give up, Margaret called in another DAR member to help us out. Her name was Sandi Gibertini. She was able to find the documents to prove that Titus Hunter was a patriot. Margaret contacted me and asked if I had any family documents for the Sullivan Hunter line. Suddenly, all those documents that I had been collecting for so many years saved the day. I was able to email them marriage certificates, land deeds, wills, and everything else that we needed, including pages from the family Bible. Just as we were seeing the light at the end of the tunnel, Margaret said that we must also prove that the **Titus Hunter** who fought under Captain Tucker in Virginia was the same Titus Hunter who died in Green County Kentucky.

That task seemed impossible, but I decided to look through all of my notebooks on the Sullivan and Hunter families to see if I could find anything. What I found was one loose paper in the bottom of a bin that had never been filed. I did not think it would ever be of any significance. The paper was a write-up on Titus's grandson, Titus Hunter I, who lived in Iowa. The article mentioned that Titus Hunter I, had a grandfather who was born in Virginia and died in Kentucky. That was the last piece of the puzzle.

Margaret submitted my application on March 15, 2021. On April 8 I got an email saying that the application had been verified by DAR. It was such a wonderful feeling to know that now **Titus Hunter** would be officially recognized as a patriot and that many more people could join DAR using my

application as a starting point. All that research will never have to be repeated.

When I got the good news I so happy that I was telling everyone I knew. I put a post on the Hunter Genealogy Facebook page and Charles Hunterston suggested that I submit my story for possible use in the newsletter. I should have warned him that I do not know how to tell a short story, I think it is the Scottish heritage. By Darlene Varney

#### Richard Grant Hunter, M.D., F.A.A.N.

Richard "Dick" G. Hunter, II passed away at his home in Savannah, Georgia on November 16, 2020. He was born on August 22, 1938, to Lt. Col. Richard G. Hunter and Elton Hall Hunter, at Fort Sam Houston, Texas. Richard retired from behavioral neurology practice in Atlanta, Georgia in 2014, to move to Savannah in order to be closer to his son Dr. Brandon Hunter and his wife Susan and grandchildren Grant and Katie. Richard was a graduate of Georgia Institute of Technology (1960), a graduate of Wharton Business School in 1961, a graduate of the University of Virginia Medical School in 1968, an intern in psychiatry at Grady Memorial Hospital in 1969, a resident in psychiatry at Emory University Hospital in 1972, and a resident in neurology at UVA University Hospital in 1975, then was in private practice in Charlottesville, Virginia. In 1985, he moved back to Atlanta, which he always considered his home. He is survived by his present wife, Sandra Hunter of Savannah, his sons Richard G. Hunter, III, Ph.D. of Boston, Massachusetts and Dr. Brandon Hunter and his wife Susan of Savannah, and step-daughters Stephanie Lain, D.V.M. and husband Pete, of Fresno, California, Devon Rutherford and her husband Ron of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and Darcie Schall of Pittsburgh, grandchildren Grant and Katherine Hunter of Savannah, and step-grandchildren Jarrett and Victoria Rutherford of Pittsburgh and Ella Schall of Pittsburgh. Besides enjoying medicine, Richard taught Sunday school and Stephens ministry at Peachtree Presbyterian Church in Atlanta and was a Past President of Clan Hunter USA. He was a member of the St. Andrews Society and Burns Club of Atlanta, the Civil War Round Table. and the Old Guard. Interment was at Peachtree Presbyterian Church, Atlanta, Georgia.

# Clan Hunter Tartan

The Clan Hunter tartan was designed in 1983 by Capt. T. Stuart Davidson, the founder of the Scottish Tartan Society. The design or Sett as it is known, has been named Hunter of Hunterston to distinguish it from other Hunter tartans such as:

- Hunter Russell Mitchell Galbraith sett A tartan shared between the four families.
- Hunters of Bute sett Hunters who sought allegiance from the Stuarts at one time.
- Hunters of Peebleshire sett An old branch of the Hunter family.

The design for our Clan tartan was carefully chosen to incorporate a green hunting base with blue representing the proximity of Hunterston to the sea. The narrow gold (yellow) stripes to signify the Chief's appointment as Royal Huntsman and red is taken from the lanyards of the hunting horns in the Chief's coat of arms.

The regular *check* pattern of a tartan is created by a repeat of the design or sett in both warp and weft in the loom. The dye range selected was considered closest to the natural vegetable dyes of old. Variations in appearance and colour do occur between individual mill producers and different weights of cloth. Clan Hunter uses a variety of cloths for different purposes. Most of the wool utilised today is Merino from Australia. All of our cloths and tartan products are manufactured in Scotland.

A Clan Chief may change a Clan tartan or add to an existing. It is up to an individual Clan member which tartan they choose but we hope you find our Clan tartan design pleasing and join us and take pride in wearing it.

#### **ALEXANDRIA SCOTTISH CHRISTMAS WALK**

There was no formal Alexandria Scottish Christmas Walk this past December because of the pandemic. However, the Saint Andrew's Society of Washington held an informal walk through Old Town Alexandria and ended up at the Old Presbyterian Meeting House to pay respects to Thomas Hunter at his gravesite on the evening of November 30, 2020. It was there that the President of the Saint Andrew's Society read the letters from William Hunter and Thomas Jefferson. Text of letters are as follows.

# Address of Welcome from the Mayor of Alexandria to Thomas Jefferson

Alexandria the March 1790 Sir

You have returned to your native Country. Permit us the inhabitants of Alexandria to join with the rest of our fellow citizens in the warmest congratulations to you on that happy event. As a commercial town, we feel ourselves particularly indebted to you for the indulgencies which your enlightened representations to the Court of France have secured to our trade. You have freed commerce from its shackles, and destroyed the first essay made in this Country towards establishing a Monopoly. But we assure you that these events, though more recent, are not more deeply impressed on our minds, than the whole tenor of your conduct when we were struggling in the sacred cause of freedom. A sense of the

benefits we have already derived from your talents and virtue, in the various offices you have filled, induces us to entertain the most auspicious hopes from your arrival at this crisis; when a constitution newly adopted, and which is to decide the fate of republican forms of Government, is commencing its operations; and when subjects of the highest importance to the Union must necessarily be discussed. That you, Sir, in every walk of life may meet with the reward of your meritorious services and fulfill the high expectations of a free and republican people is our sincere wish.

## Response to the Address of Welcome From Thomas Jefferson

Alexandria. Mar. 11. 1790. Sir

Accept my sincere thanks for yourself and the worthy citizens of Alexandria, for their kind congratulations on my return to my native country. I am happy to learn that they have felt benefit from the encouragements to our commerce which have been given by an allied nation. But truth and candor oblige me at the same time to declare you are indebted for those encouragements solely to the friendly dispositions of that nation which has shown itself ready on every occasion to adopt all arrangements which might strengthen our ties of mutual interest and friendship.

Convinced that the republican is the only form of government which is not eternally at open or secret war with the rights of mankind, my prayers and efforts shall be cordially contributed to the support of that we have so happily established. It is indeed an animating thought that, while we are securing the rights of ourselves and our posterity, we are pointing out the way to struggling nations who wish, like us, to emerge from their tyrannies also. Heaven help their struggles, and lead them, as it has done us, triumphantly thro' them.

Accept, Sir, for yourself and the citizens of Alexandria the homage of my thanks for their civilities, & the assurance of those sentiments of respect & attachment with which I have the honor
